Dear Parent,

The State of Kansas requires a “well- child” physical to start school in Kansas. *

Well-child physical examinations are important to the health and well-being of your child. This is why it is important for your child to visit their primary care provider every year, even when he or she is not sick. These are called well-child check-ups. During well-child check-ups, your child’s physician:

- Does a complete physical exam
- Checks your child’s development and nutrition
- Checks your child’s vision, hearing and teeth
- Gives immunizations as needed
- Orders lab work as needed
- Gives you and your child education and guidance about health and development.

Well-child checkup and physicals let you know your child is developing properly. School entrance physical examinations must be conducted within 12 months of school entry date.

Most insurance plans, including Kan Care and Medicaid cover annual child exams.

Per Kansas Statute 72-5214, Doctors of Chiropractic Medicine are not allowed to perform school entrance physical examinations, although they may conduct sports physicals for Middle and High School Students.

Health professionals approved to conduct a well-child school entrance physical examination in the state of Kansas are: Physicians (MD and DO), physician assistants, advanced nurse practitioners, or specifically trained RN’s.
