Student Information

Over the past several years, 60% of Hutchinson High School graduates have attended community college after graduation, while 20% begin their college careers at a four year university/college. The remaining 20% enter the work force, join the military or pursue other options. There have been 7 National Merit semifinalists in the last six years and 17 commended scholars.

Curriculum and Instruction

All students at Hutchinson High School are required to take 5 classes each trimester. With classes before and after the main part of the day, it is possible for students to take six or seven classes each trimester. Classes meet on a modified block schedule with a seminar on Wednesday a.m. The M-T-T-F schedule holds 75 minute classes with shorter classes on the seminar day. There are 180 days per year. Students earn a half credit in most courses by earning a passing grade for a trimester. A broad selection of courses are available including college prep, IB, Career and Technical Education courses, special education and general courses. Through our Career and Technical Education Academy, students can choose from a variety of courses and programs that include college credit and industry certifications. Most required classes have honors sections for high ability students. Juniors and seniors are able to take college classes at Hutchinson Community College. Hutchinson High School also offers the International Baccalaureate Diploma program with a wide range of IB courses. Students may opt for certification or obtain a full IB Diploma. Marking System

All courses are graded on a scale with A=4.0, B=3.0 etc. After the cumulative grade point average is calculated, bonus points of .0833 are added to each student's GPA for each semester credit earned in an IB/ honors course. This weighted GPA is the basis for class ranking.
