KINDERGARTEN

Kindergarten celebrated 100 days of learning! We counted to 100, ate 100 piece snacks and wrote to 100. In reading, we are getting better at reading CVC words, and learning new trick words every week!

FIRST GRADE

First grade has been working hard on telling time to the hour and to the half hour. It's been fun to see them using this throughout the day to let us know it's almost time for music or that it's lunch time!



SECOND GRADE

Second grade loves Mystery Science! We started a new unit that asks the question "How did a tree travel halfway across the world?". We discovered that seeds travel differently depending on their attributes. Now we are making our own seeds that we will test to see how far they can travel.

THIRD GRADE



The Reno County Extension Agency came to our third grade classrooms and taught us the process of how farmers plant wheat. We watched a video of the entire process from wheat to table. Then, we were able to make bread in a bag and even took a little loaf home to share with our families.

FOURTH GRADE

The fourth graders learned about Personal Safety Awareness this month. One of the four PSA lessons was taught by our Community Resource Officer, Officer Wells. The lessons were focused on helping students know what to do in uncomfortable or unsafe situations.



FIFTH GRADE

Fifth grade has just finished up a unit on the American Revolution. We spent time learning about the events leading up to the Revolutionary War. To end the unit, the fifth graders were challenged with "A Boston Tea Party" STEM Project. They had to keep their tea bag from getting wet inside of a crate they created.



SIXTH GRADE

The sixth graders have been studying Ancient Greece in Social Studies. Besides reading about them in History, students have been writing "love letters" from gods and goddess in ELA and building Ancient Greece temples in Science using spaghetti noodles and marshmallows. State Assessments and moving to the seventh grade building are on the horizon for sixth grade. The principal and counselor are coming to talk with our students about the process and about the classes and experiences that are available to them. We are so excited to hear about the questions they have for next year and to see what classes they plan on signing up for!
