I. Workers Comp Claims

Claims continue to run below 2016-17. Through mid-September, the district has had 11 claims. For the same period in 2016-17, the district has sustained 19 claims.

One of the areas with the greatest reductions so far have been staff injured by students. Kelley believes that staff training, particularly recognizing the triggers of some of our students, has been helpful.

II. Crisis Go app update

Continue to work with vendor to get good training videos and some other tweaks.

III. Other items

Electronic security remains in the news. Jason said the district has added layers of security, but these layers are like locking the doors to your house. The locks keep honest or lazy people at bay. Someone who is dishonest and persistent will find a way in. Security remains a high priority for our tech staff.

Amy said the Hutcherson Center now has electronic locks, and those locks are working well. A side benefit is that it has encouraged staff to wear their ID badges.
